

those, I think this bill will help that. I think it has a chance to meet both those concerns, and I'd ask your support for the legislation. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. Clerk, I understand you have an amendment.

CLERK: Senator Wehrbein would move to amend the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: File it on refile on Select, please.

SPEAKER WITHEM: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, any further amendments? Senator Chambers, on the motion to advance.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Mr. President, I do have an amendment that is coming to the desk, and I will speak on the motion first because I want to ask Senator Wesely a question. Senator Wesely, on page 3 of the bill, in line 11, we have the word "services". And in line 15, we have the term "service delivery system". Here is my question. When we're up in this... in lines 10 and 11, we have this language: "This will allow for restructuring of state and local services". Are they talking about something different from service delivery systems, which is what is being discussed farther down in the bill? Do they mean that they're going to change the services, as would seem to be indicated in line 11, or is this bill dealing with a service delivery system? So, is it the services or the system or both?

SENATOR WESELY: Actually, your question runs to Senator Hilgert's question, and it's not the services so much, although there might be some consolidation, say, of case management services, but it's the system that we're really addressing. So I think you've pointed out something that could be clarified.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if that's really what it is, maybe Senator Hilgert wants to add it...offer an amendment that in line 11 would say, instead of services, service delivery system or systems, because I...if you're going to pass this bill, I would hope that it's clear in stating what is going to be done. Because if you, by passing this bill, are saying that your intent, and, Senator Hilgert, I'm talking about people like us now who are concerned about the services that people actually
