

property from an unknown source, or at least that section can be used to deal with it and provide some safeguards. The other amendment has to do with Section 8. It drops the language, "or dispose of property on loan to the museum without a lender's permission ." Section 8 is a section that deals with taking conservation measures or other types of what are, I think, intended to be emergency measures. But to the extent...most of that section is left in place, but to the extent that it deals with the disposal of property without some of the safeguards built into the other parts of the bill, it just seemed to me appropriate to deal with disposal of property under the more protected sections, which I think they can be. It's certainly a bill overdue, in terms of time. I'm sure they need some of these provisions. So, I'm just trying to give it a...what, in my opinion, is just a little bit more balance for the property owners. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Discussion on the Beutler amendment? Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Thank you, Madam President. I appreciate Senator Beutler contacting me this morning to bring his concerns relative to the bill to my attention and would support the amendment that has been filed. As I indicated to him, obviously, we haven't had a lot of...haven't had much opportunity to really address whether or not this is something that will need to be revisited or not, but I've indicated to him that after consultation with the Historical Society and the Museum Association, we'll look at the potential of bringing this, the particular issues that he's addressed, back next year...work with Senator Beutler making sure that we have his concerns taken care of, but at this...at this point, as he's indicated, this bill is long overdue and it needs to move forward. And with that, I would support and ask the membership to support the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Further discussion on the Beutler amendment? Seeing none, Senator Beutler waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Beutler amendment to LB 1276. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.
