LB 1157, 1304, 1321

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to advance LB 1321 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to advance LB 1321 to E & R for engrossment. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Before we continue with the next bill, Senator Bohlke has her family this morning...some of her family here: Sharon Marvin, her sister; Naomi Gidley, her mother; Marcella and John Doak, her aunt and uncle, and they are all from Omaha. They're sitting under the north balcony. Would you please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. Thank you. LB 1304, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 1304. Senator, I do have E & Rs, first of all.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to adopt the E & R amendments (AM7256) to LB 1304.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 1304. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President, members of the body, AM3906 is LB 1157. This amendment amends the State Building Code to adopt the Uniform Code for Building Conservation. This change in statute is one recommended...is a recommendation made by the Nebraska Task Force on Historic Preservation. In 1992, the Legislature enacted LB 706, which created the Nebraska Task Force on Historic Preservation. The task force was charged with reviewing laws, programs, projects, and activities relating to
