SENATOR LANDIS: I can see people are shoveling coal into this railroad train already. Senator Preister, do as you will, but I don't think so, but you're a free agent, and if you want to try, go ahead. I don't think that this is an appropriate place for that, but stranger things have happened at this time of the legislative session.

SENATOR PREISTER: In deference to the bill itself and to your overly persuasive communications this morning, I will not introduce it, but certainly was not going to pass up the opportunity to stand in support of my constituency, particularly the elderly and the low-income people who live in east Omaha who continue to pay and subsidize those people in other parts of the city higher insurance premiums. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you...thank you, Senator Preister. There are no further lights. Senator Landis. He waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Landis amendment to LB 515. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Landis' amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to advance LB 515 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to advance LB 515 to E & R for engrossment. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We'll move to General File. LB 345.

CLERK: LB 345, a bill introduced by Senator Jones and others.
