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paycheck. Is that not correct?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's correct.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay. So you would be placed in the position of not being able to claim a refund for dollars that were withheld from your paycheck.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: But, Senator Wickersham, you would have entered into an agreement to have those dollars spent...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ..for your benefit...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ..on these programs.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: And, Senator Brashear, why would I have entered into that agreement?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: You would have entered into that agreement as a part of the process by which you sought and obtained employment with the employer.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: So, in effect, I have to pay back my employer for getting a job.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: No, you do not have to.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Who spends the money that is withheld from my paycheck? Who spends the money that's withheld from my paycheck and I can't get a credit on my state income tax return? Senator, who spends that money?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well, the statute says at Section 2, if I can direct your attention to it, the wage bene...

SENATOR WILL: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ..the wage benefit credit shall be paid or applied by the employee, by the employee for company training programs.
