

title. It's the same thing. Their state just calls it something different than our state does, and so what this salvage certificate really does is issue to recognize the ownership of a salvaged vehicle. All LB 1306 does is recognize the legal fact and puts some statutory language that overcomes that DMV interpretation, and the committee amendment clarifies that now what Nebraska is going to get is a salvage title, so regardless of what they get from the other state, you'll now get a salvage title. It doesn't change the salvage title laws other than just recognize what other states call salvage certificates. And with that, I'd be happy to advance...or answer any questions, but there's one other area that we want to deal with, and that's another amendment coming in the area of motor vehicle laws. So with that, I'd close on the committee amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the opening on the committee amendment. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. Senator Kristensen, I just have a quick question. I've had...I have some people who want to be sure that this is going to help with...they go to Iowa or someplace to bring a car back to...a salvage car to fix up for their teenager or something. Is this going to correct that problem they've had with the certificate of title?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, if the other state, and depends on where the vehicle comes from, if it comes from Illinois, Texas, California, and they have salvage certificates...

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, I heard what you said about that, yeah.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...yes, this is what...this is what will take care of it. Now there's another one that we've done earlier, called bonded titles, that takes care of a lot of those problems.

SENATOR CROSBY: That...I have...I thought there was another bill.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right. That we've done elsewhere.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. So I haven't flipped a cog. Thank you.
