SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator, there are no lights on. Do you have closing? Closing is waived. Shall LB 1069 be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Members, we would like your attention to the board if possible. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1069.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1069 is advanced. LB 1277.

CLERK: LB 1277 by Senator Will. (Read title.) Introduced on January 17, referred to General Affairs. I have no committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Will to open on the bill.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. LB 1277 is a clarifying bill in the area of pickle cards. It would specifically authorize pickle...pickle cards game called a seal game that currently actually has been in operation. There...it's not specifically recognized in statute. It's the same in every other way...in every way as an ordinary pickle game except for the fact that there are a predetermined number of losing pickle cards qualify the buyer for subsequent prize given at the end of the game. It simply would clarify that that is legal. There was no opposition in committee, and I would encourage the body to advance LB 1277. I have an example of a seal card if anyone would like to look at it. Beyond that, I would answer any questions.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I understand we have an amendment to the bill, Mr. Clerk.
