overlooked, I guess. Basically, right now in enforcing well drilling standards and licensing, they can enforce them against individuals but not against companies who have no licensed individuals. And there are some companies apparently who come in from time to time across state lines and try to operate in Nebraska without going through the proper procedures. So all this does is change definitions so that they can enforce our existing law without changing any of the existing law, so that they can enforce the existing law against any company, individual, anybody and everybody. That's the only point of the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thanks, Senator Beutler. There are no lights on. Do you have closing on the committee amendments? Committee...closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Beutler, to open on the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, no opening, that...it's a very...I've explained the bill. That's all there is to it. Thank you.
