SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Cudaback, on the first division. Senator Cudaback waives off. Senator Witek. I don't see Senator Witek. Senator Hartnett. I'm sorry, there you are.

SENATOR WITEK: Thank you, Senator. I'm sorry, I was looking for Senator Lynch. I was going to ask him some questions about the Building Commission or Maintenance...Building Maintenance Committee. I would agree with this part of the Bromm amendment. Some of the language in this amendment, even...I'm talking to some people on the Appropriations Committee. There was an impression from them that the Appropriations Committee would have some oversight. But if you look at the language in this amendment specifically, it's almost token...it has nothing to do with approval, it has to do with the people who are going to touch base, basically, with the Appropriations Committee on the \$30 million. And we're getting this money from the same fund that we now get the money for the Building Committee fund...Building Maintenance. We have this Building Maintenance Committee, and I apologize, I don't know a whole lot about it, I have never served on it, and the only contact that I've had with those members is through the Government Committee talking about the need for a lot of these improvements in our buildings. I don't see why we can't have a same special committee set up, through the Legislature, for some of the oversight in these areas of technology. It's clear that we're not getting enough contact with the executive branch on what their intentions are. We're not getting... We're getting...we're getting a little bit of them coming to us and telling us, mostly after the fact, what they're doing. And I don't know about others on this floor but I'm getting very nervous about the fact that this legislation keeps coming into the Legislature to give them approval to do something, money to do something, but we don't know what that something is with any of this. We never have any concrete plan. We don't see the actual way that they're going to carry this out, it's just somebody's idea, give us \$30 million to do it, or \$2 billion to do it and trust us. And it's not a trust situation here, it's that we're supposed to be responsible when we're making these decisions. And in order to make a decision you have to have the information on exactly what decision needs to be made. And again I feel with this 1190 we're not getting that information.
