

rate, Senator, I think that the intent is that once the millennium project is completed, that no additional cigarette tax dollars would be used and that they would go back to the original funding pattern for those dollars. Is that what you're asking about?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, it says "until" such has happened.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes. And I don't think there's... And as I understand it, there isn't a commitment to spend \$30 million, for example, if we don't need to spend \$30 million. If it costs 25, that's to the good. So we're not...we're not, as I understand it we're not committing to spend \$30 million, we're committing to spend up to X, if that's what's required, but having no real desire to get to that level if we don't have to.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I think it says until it's been completed, but I wonder if it goes on it says they can expend the money then after this change has taken place?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, after the project is completed that's it, that's the extent of this authorization.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Then the money does go back to the building...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's my understanding, Senator, yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's your understanding?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Can you tell...could you find out some...if that's just understanding, or if that's really the fact or... Maybe we can do it at a later...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yeah.
