

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...they're all going to be under the main contractor?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think those will mostly come through these proposals that we will receive. If what some are calling to my attention that this may well get cheaper, that there are other options out there. These should show up in these RFPs. And obviously we're going to be looking as broadly and widely as we can over the landscape to find out those that can...maybe somebody will do this for a dollar, you just push a button, I don't know.

SENATOR VRTISKA: (Laugh.) Well now, that would be nice.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But I mean the point is we're certainly...

SENATOR VRTISKA: I understand.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...going to have to evaluate that, and because there are uncertainties, unknowns, it's very difficult to write this legislation so that there's flexibility and still we have oversight. I mean I think it's unlikely, unusual to have it in the law that you...appropriations to meet quarterly just to oversight the situation. That's our attempt to try to get closer at this.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I appreciate your answers and I am obviously concerned, as I know you are, about the total costs and where...and basically where the money is coming from. But I understand...

SENATOR WILL: Time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...things have to be done, so we have to move on. Thank you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Bromm, yours is the last light, you're recognized to close on the first portion of your amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, thank you, Mr. President. Again, the first portion of this amendment is a relatively minor change, I think, compared to the rest of what we've been talking about,
