SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. Clerk, are there any items for the record?

CLERK: I have no items at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Let us then turn to LB 1055.

CLERK: Senator Maurstad, I have Enrollment and Review amendments, first of all, Senator.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 1055.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed. The E & R amendments are adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: First amendment to the bill, Senators Lindsay, Wesely, AM3304, I have a note they want to withdraw.

SPEAKER WITHEM: It is...Senator Wesely, what was that.

SENATOR WESELY: I thought we were going to substitute. I think we are going to substitute.

CLERK: Okay.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely is asking unanimous consent to substitute an amendment. Hearing no objection, it is so ordered. Senator, Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That would be, Mr. Clerk, AM3733, I believe.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay to open on AM3733 to be found on Journal page 1187.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. AM3733 is an amendment dealing with the ability to do the background check for purpose of buying a firearm. The amendment, the amendment would clarify, when dealing with the mental health background check, it'd clarify what...who could or could not purchase the firearm. It would make it easier to determine that. It provides a mechanism for the State Patrol to check into that. It is my understanding, the NRA has reviewed it and
