

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Of the 100 or the 200 sections, I am going to have...it is going to take me just a minute to go find that, but I think there is another one there.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. If it turns out that this is the section, is it...is it your opinion that any current nonprofit corporation would need to follow this provision in order to...well, let's just talk about the execution of contracts, generally,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that any existing nonprofit corporation, once this law goes into effect, would have to follow this provision in order to properly execute a contract?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, and the only exception I make to that is if you have an existing contract that has a clause in there that would do otherwise. In other words, it may be an option, and those sort of things, but all things being equal, yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Well, in that case then, if you could just let me know whether there is anything that's directly...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I will find the...I will find the deed section...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...applicable to conveyances, as opposed to these contracts.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Very good, thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR CROSEY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Vrtiska.
