It doesn't specifically say that, I do understand, and perhaps that is an oversight. But that would be my intent because all of them, all of those who had insurance at the time, should have been so informed and weren't. And there are, there's several issues involved out of, out of the, certainly the one county that I'm not altogether convinced that the agency was waiting for ten days before they went through with the, with the filing of a suspension order. And they wouldn't withdraw it, I understand, because there was a \$37 charge made by the court to the prosecuting agency for a withdrawal of charge and they wouldn't withdraw it because it cost them \$37 to withdraw, something that had been filed too soon. And I can't vouch to the accuracy of that, but I was told by people who had did some investigation in this area.
