SENATOR JANSSEN: No. No, it wasn't.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Maybe you can tell me why that was put in in the first place.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, it was just to tighten it up a little bit. Even though the parties all had to agree, there were some problems with maybe liability on the part of counsel with the wording of "irregularities," that they would waive the right to any irregularity, so that was a problem with some of the counsels. So, no, I didn't have any problem with it being taken out.

SENATOR PIRSCH: And this is only now intended then that a stipulation of the 31 days prior to the date of the trial would only be for county court.

SENATOR JANSSEN: County courts, right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR PIRSCH: With your amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, that's right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. I'll support that amendment and the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Janssen, you may close on your amendment. The question is, shall the Janssen amendment to the committee amendments be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Janssen's amendment to the committee amendments.
