CLERK: 29 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The committee amendments are adopted. For discussion on the motion to advance. Seeing no one, Senator Beutler, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Waive closing.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Closing is waived. The question is, shall LB 1201 be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk. Call is raised, by the way, now that the vote's occurred.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1201.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1201 advances. Would announce a change in the agenda. LB 1343 will be passed over in this special order consideration, however, it should be reinserted after LB 1088, between LB 1088 and LB 1171 in the regular General File 1996 Senator Priority Bills which follows, which then leads us to LB 1264. "Senator" Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Brashear offers 1264. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 17 of this year, referred to the Transportation Committee, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending, Mr. President. (AM3179 is found on page 829 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is Senator Brashear's spirit plate bill. Basically, what the bill would do, it would enact three new provisions of law which would create a new class of specialty license plate known as the "Cornhusker Spirit" plates. They'd be issued for the usual variety of vehicles. The original application fee would be \$70 which would be charged. Thirty of that would go to the Department of Motor Vehicles' Cash Fund, which is consistent with what our message plate existing fee is
