SENATOR BEUTLER: I'm not arguing it.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, the intent is that it's divided of the campuses of the state college system and University of Nebraska. It's read...it's intended to be the campuses of the state college system and the campuses of the University of Nebraska, so there'd be three universities and three state colleges, everybody gets a sixth.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, my remarks will be brief. I believe license plates are for the purposes of identifying cars. Once we start down this route, I can't think of any good purpose that shouldn't deserve equal treatment. I'm going to be voting no, and that's the reason. It's not because I'm opposed to anything, but plates are for a purpose and the more you clutter them up the less good they do to identify the vehicle. That's what they for. If you like bumper stickers, you can slap them all the way across the back of the car and you can pay a hundred dollars for each bumper sticker and the same purpose will be accomplished without spending half the time of some portion of every legislative session expanding this to other worthy causes of which there is no limit to the number.
