

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Brashear on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I endorse the...Senator Chambers' amendment. I thank him for offering it and urge its adoption.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers to close. Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All in favor vote aye. Opposed vote nay. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Chambers amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next matter.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, I have a second amendment from Senator Chambers. (FA598 found on page 1650 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, and Senator Brashear, I didn't have time to show this to you, but I meant to. It's again on page 2. Under Senator Brashear's original language, it says that a resident of Nebraska may apply to the Department of Motor Vehicles for "his Cornhusker Spirit Plate. I would change, "a resident of Nebraska" and put, "any person." And, Senator, we know that a person...it...the plate is going to go to a car that's registered in Nebraska, but it's conceivable that a person may not be a resident but, nevertheless, have a car that's registered in this state. If you don't want to accept it, then I'm not going to fight to get it, but under this language in the bill, if a person is not a resident he or she cannot even make an application for these plates for himself or herself or for somebody else.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brashear to address the Chambers amendment.
