LB 108A, 108, 1264A

Initial. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on LB 1264A. Have you all voted? We're voting on LB 1264A. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays on the advancement of LB 1264A.

SENATOR CROSBY: The bill advances. We will now proceed to LB 108A on General File. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 108A. (Read title.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby, members of the Legislature, this is the funding for the conjunctive use bill, and as you can see, it anticipates \$129,000 of expense in '98-97 (sic) and \$105,000 in '97-98. According to the fiscal note, that's the amount that's estimated by DWR to provide assistance to the NRDs to help them with their particular duties under this particular bill. I would ask for the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Before continuing, we do have some guests that I think are maybe leaving, in the north balcony. Senator Fisher has as his guests ten students from Hastings Community College who are in health care administration and their sponsors. Would you all stand, if you're here...I'm sorry...yes, you are here. All right. Would you stand and be welcomed by your Legislature. Thank you for being here. Discussion on LB 108A, Senator Dierks.
