

SENATOR LINDSAY: That is correct, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR CROSBY: No objections? So ordered. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members, this amendment is a floor amendment, it is a handwritten floor amendment that would have been passed around to you actually before you got the copy of AM4213. It is an amendment to 4213 and it makes two technical changes, one is on page 7, line 2, it clarifies that we have a...that defining when something is or is not in the public interest. This is a technical issue that was caught by Senator Wesely and we are including that and getting that so that it conforms with another change that was made earlier in the bill. The second item is a question that was caught by Senator Matzke on page 9, line 12 that it strikes the language, "Pursuant to Chapter 21, Article 19," and I want to make clear that what the intent of this is to allow the Attorney General authority, it is not to limit the Attorney General's authority rather it is to grant the Attorney General that oversight authority that exists in statute without, I guess, limiting the Attorney General to that particular portion of the statute. So it is whatever general authority is granted by a statute or a common law would be the authority that the Attorney General would continue to retain. With that I would be happy to answer any questions regarding the amendment, would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Wesely, on the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, yeah, I just want to rise in support of the Lindsay amendment, and I do appreciate his cooperation on this. It does clarify a couple of points so would be helpful, I would rise in support of the amendment, thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Matzke.

SENATOR MATZKE: Madam President, members of the Legislature, likewise we have discussed this and I think this is a very necessary correction of the language and the amendment and I would support the Lindsay amendment and urge its adoption.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Matzke. There are no
