ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Lindsay's amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The next amendment I have is offered by Senator Lindsay. Senator, this is 3712, I understand you want to withdraw?

SENATOR CROSBY: It is withdrawn.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The next amendment I have is from Senator Will. Senator, withdraw?

SENATOR CROSBY: It is withdrawn.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Both of your amendments, Senator? Senator Hilgert, I have an amendment from you, 4058, to withdraw? Two of them. The next amendment I have is offered by Senator McKenzie who is excused, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Is anyone authorized to do Senator McKenzie's amendment? Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President and members. I intend to withdraw this amendment. Senator McKenzie had offered it, she is over in Exec Board in one of their hearings. This...with this amendment is intended simply to draw attention to the point, something that maybe for future reference ought to be looked at and what it indicates, what it would do is to exclude or to apply this bill only to, or to both nonprofit and...or excuse me, to grandfather in existing nonprofits. It is intended primarily, it is not going to be voted on, it is intended primarily just simply to make the point and to make sure that we're aware that nonprofit corporations, as we go through health care change, that nonprofit corporations...there...there...also we might look at oversight of some of the mergers and acquisitions that are going on in that area.
