

members of the Legislature, let me ask Senator Wehrbein some additional questions. Senator Wehrbein, how many corrections officers serving as guards or in a security capacity will be in each one of these Quonset huts?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I don't know the number, they will be supervised. Just a minute. There will be one unit manager, one case manager, two caseworkers; that would be four in each unit on the day shift, and three at night...and evening, and two at night, so there's three shifts. That's nine on the...nine around...nine total, but four, three, and two on each shift, on the shifts.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what are their hours when there will be two working?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's the evening shift, which is eight...eight, two to ten.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Two to ten. Now you've got 100 men who by definition are criminals, dangerous, predators that stop people from walking from their front door to their car in safety, and you've got them in this setting, and you believe that these two people can prevent the kind of things I'm mentioning from happening?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I'm not an expert on criminal behavior. I think...once again, these will be classified so some of those types of behavior that you just said I doubt will be in that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then let's not make it...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It probably will be more passive crimes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let's not put it in a penitentiary setting, since you're not an expert there, and maybe you're not an expert on the other. But I want to take us out of the criminal setting. If you had 100 men on a ship and they had been away from women for a long time and their hormones began to rage and another man began to look like a fire extinguisher for sexual purposes and you have two...I don't know what corporals are in the Navy, what the equivalent of that would be, you got two Navy corporals,...
