

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Laugh.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you think that they could stop...they could supervise these 100 men? Is that what you're telling me...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, that's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that the two...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...that's the implication of this particular staffing, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, how many of you buy that? Senator Hillman is looking, from the way I judge her expression, looking skeptical. Senator Witek is about to fall out of her chair, she knows that that's impractical. And Senator Schimek is not here, I wanted to ask her a couple of questions. But when you have this kind of situation, two people do not constitute adequate supervision. This is falling into the category of the kinds of things Judge Kopf talked about in his order where you all are interested in efficiently packing men into this Quonset hut. You don't really care what happens. If there are violent assaults, you don't care; if there are homosexual assaults, you don't care. You're trying to give the Governor and yourselves something in a political year. This building of two Quonset huts is not going to solve the problem of overcrowding. I had said earlier, in connection with these bills where you want to put these spending lids on...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...political subdivisions, that you're wrong to talk about wanting to create a crisis for them while at the same time being unwilling to create a crisis here that would force the Legislature to take...we need a comprehensive program to deal with crimes and punishment and building two Quonset huts is not doing that. You're making the situation worse. Senator Wehrbein, I guarantee you there are going to be some assaults and you're going to have some lawsuits. And you and the other members here are going to bear the responsibility because you knew it and you said it's not important. Not you, Senator Wehrbein, you personally did not say it's not important, I mean
