SENATOR WITEK: We don't know how much we've actually received yet?

SENATOR BROWN: ...we'll get the numbers for you.

SENATOR WITEK: Okay. But you're hoping to receive (inaudible) million...

SENATOR BROWN: We are on track to get close to \$40 million.

SENATOR WITEK: Okay, so we are still hoping for \$40 million, but we're...for sure we've written off about 5 to \$6 million...

SENATOR BROWN: Right.

SENATOR WITEK: ...for the Maximus,...

SENATOR BROWN: Right.

SENATOR WITEK: ...for sure written off. And that's the deficit appropriation that we're putting in our budget of the 5 to \$6 million.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR WITEK: Did any of that 5 to \$6 million go into the Department of Social Services for reimbursement of their managed care program? Do you know if it did or not?

SENATOR BROWN: None of it is for managed care, no.

SENATOR WITEK: None of it is for managed care. Okay, I was just curious, 'cause I know Maximus was also hired to do...for \$3 million in DSS to do their 24-hour hotline on the managed care. And I was...if they haven't come up with the money...

SENATOR BROWN: It's a different...it's a different...

SENATOR WITEK: It's a different contract.

SENATOR BROWN: A whole different thing, whole different thing.
