

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, please return. We are preparing to vote on a Brown amendment to LB 1189. Senator Brown has requested a roll call vote after members have all checked in. And she has made the request that that be in reverse order. Further, she'd like everyone to vote yes, but I don't think that's in her power to request that. Senator Pirsch, could you check in please. Senator Chambers, Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Robinson, could you check in please. Senator Wesely. Senator Lindsay. Mr. Clerk, proceed to call the roll in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1717-18 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 13 nays on the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is not agreed to. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator, I have a note you want to withdraw AM4075. Mr. President, the next amendment, by Senator Pedersen. (See AM4084 on page 1547 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pedersen. By the way, this...based upon the announcement I made earlier this afternoon, this will probably be the last amendment we'll take up on LB 1189, at least until we have proceeded to deal with the General File appropriations bills and property tax bills still pending on the agenda. Senator Pedersen, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have not done a vote count on this so I'm going to do the opening and if you have some questions, ask them to me and I'll try and keep it as short as I can to see if we have support for it or not. Basically this amendment would take the \$630,000 which is needed to put with about \$9 million to finish and start the construction of the secure confinement facility for juveniles that was authorized two years ago in LB 988. My reasoning for doing this is since that time, with more experience and more study into the situation, is the young people that we'd be putting into this institution are people who are already in a facility, and these are people who have
