LB 1190A, 1190

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein, we are now considering the committee amendments. Senator Wehrbein, there are no lights on, you are recognized to close.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I very briefly close. Very briefly the amendments have become the bill, the white copy, and I think we've thoroughly discussed it. I've lost track of how many hours, but the bill is in the...the amendment form is now in the shape that I think we can move forward. I'll talk a little bit about the A bill when we get to the A bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the closing. The question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted to LB 1190? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Members, once again, not telling you how to vote or even telling you that you need to vote, but if you care to vote, thank you. Members, please record. Or, Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendments are adopted. Any...Senator Wehrbein, I would recognize you to open on the bill, but that might be superfluous.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, at least redundant, so I'll just ask to move the bill forward, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay. Question before the body is the advancement of LB 1190. There is no discussion, is there a closing? Closing's waived. The question is, shall LB 1190 be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays on the advancement of LB 1190, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1190 advances. LB 1190A.

CLERK: (LB) 1190A, a bill by Senator Wehrbein as Chair of Appropriations. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on March 7, referred directly to General File. Senator Lynch, for recordkeeping purposes, I had an amendment, Senator, but I have a note you want to withdraw. Is that right?
