SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, anything else? Nothing further on the...Senator Wehrbein, would you care to close on the motion to advance?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, very briefly, Senator Withem. This uses a combination of (cigarette tax money, (inaudible), General Fund, state agency sources, revolving process, some federal funds. Right now the total's 29 million, I want to assure with what we've done in this that this will not be spent if we do not need it. The requests for proposals have gone out, they will be coming back in May and June. We will be reviewing that, DAS obviously will. If there is no need to spend this kind of money, it will not be spent, you can be assured of that. If we can do it for less, we will be able to see that. And so at this point...and we also will then be reappropriating year-to-year, this only will do the first year and we can go from there. But you can see how it lays out in your pink sheet, your fiscal note. With that, I'd urge advancement of the bill to Select File.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is, shall LB 1190A be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The question is, shall LB 1190A be advanced? Have all members in the Chamber who care to vote voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the advancement of 1190A.

SENATOR COORDSEN: LB 1190A is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 29 introduced by Senator Warner at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5, referred to Appropriations, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President. I have no committee amendments to the bill, I should say.
