All the members who are not excused are now present. The question before the body is the adoption of the Lindsay amendment to LB 29. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. I apologize to the body, the Clerk explained to me that again I was in error. It happened twice in my life and you got to witness one time. Roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.) 19 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President. (See page 1730 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Lindsay amendment is not adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I'll raise the call. Senator Warner, there are no other lights on, did you wish to close on the bill?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would ask that the bill be advanced, I don't know how many thousands of General Fund money, if the bill passes, that may be avoided. It may be none if the federal government changes their mind. But, I would hope the body would advance the bill at this point in order to not have the state directly paying all of these defaults.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Warner. You have heard the closing, the question before the body is the advancement of LB 29. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 29.

SENATOR COORDSEN: LB 29 is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.
