SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right?

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: And the state will no longer have any participation in that then?

SENATOR WESELY: The counties won't have any participation in that.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The counties will have...

SENATOR WESELY: In terms of funding.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Excuse me, the counties will no longer have any participation in that.

SENATOR WESELY: That's right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Then, will the regions be changed?

SENATOR WESELY: I think what will happen, Senator Janssen, I don't know if you remember that other handout that I had that showed the map. Instead of a variety of regions, you would probably see, in my guess, eight regions with common boundaries and one administrative office for the region with the dispersion of sites for people to come in and get help when they needed it, instead of a multiple of administrative offices scattered with different staff in each of them. So I think that is what the evolution would bring you at the end of the three-year period, that we would be working on this.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right then, how many do you think there will be then?

SENATOR WESELY: How many regions?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah, how many regions, after three years?

SENATOR WESELY: Between six and eight. Every system has had
