word partial, those of you who are familiar with workers' compensation understand that we have both partial disabilities and we have total disabilities, and we have permanent and we have temporary within that. Somebody had found that by an interpretation of partial would mean that a person who had a temporary total disability since...would be allowed to collect both workers' comp coverage and unemployment at the same time. And I do not believe, nor did the members of the Business and Labor Committee, at least, several...the majority of the members, that that was the intent of workers' comp or unemployment, to allow both of those worker benefits to be drawn at the same time. So, with that, I would urge the adoption of LB 1167, that is the amendment that is up there.
