Sometimes when we really don't understand the problem, I...as Janssen is an old "Danski" from Denmark, and I'm from Denmark, half of me at least. You know over in Denmark something like this started some years ago, in fact a couple hundred years ago. And finally they determined that administratively they could really do a lot better job. It's a completely socialistic country right now, but they could really do a great job running their country, providing no unit of government was bigger than 300,000 people. This is a true story. Wolfson Berger and others will tell you about this and how it works. And if you ever visited Danska then you could understand that it's true. And it's a great country filled with great people and great food. My grandpa was a master baker. But I have to tell you that even in the city of Copenhagen they have small communities, they decided that 300,000 people was about the size that you needed to economically be able to justify a hospital unit, a school district, a police department and so on down the line. I don't know I was just thinking about that as I was thinking about this proposal and amendment, 300,000 people out northwest and west from here, how far will we have to go to have a unit of state government that could in fact administer what some people think is effectively? I think you would go all the way from Wyoming-Colorado border, all the way down past Grand...Kearney and into Grand Island area. You know it's an exaggeration, but not really, not really. How we going to determine who's going to vote on what with this proposal? Do...is there some kind of a petition process? I think there is where county boards and
