

happen anyplace unless the people in the county want it to happen. As far as this being offered in 292, Senator Chambers, it is germane, nobody has questioned the germaneness. And I think probably you have offered things in your career several times that was questioned whether or not they were germane and whether or not they would hurt the bill. This is very compatible to this bill, it addresses everything that I think we have talked about in trying to lessen the reliance on property tax. It is only an enabler, it is only meant to be helpful to county government in looking at the kinds of things this body says it wants local government to do. Again, it is permissive, it can only enhance what we currently have out there. And, with that, I would ask for the advancement of this amendment to 292CA. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hillman. The question before the body now then is the adoption of the Hillman amendment. All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

SENATOR HILLMAN: I think we'll need a call of the house and have everyone check in.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question is, shall the house go under call? All of those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote nay.

SENATOR HILLMAN: I'd like to request a roll call vote, too, please.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Roll call vote has been requested when all of the members are present.

(Journal shows vote for placing the house under call was 39 ayes, 0 nays.)
