Now if it is such a good thing to value ag land at no higher than 80 percent of fair market value, what is it that makes them unwilling to put that in the constitution because we know they are going to value it higher. Senator Bromm, Senator Klein, the rest of you who know the power of the NSEA, if they decide they need some money from somewhere, then they are going to get the Legislature to raise the valuation on ag land because you are not going to...

They like to say don't talk about rural-urban clashes. That is what you saw exemplified and the rurals, as usual,...
