SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. This amendment would change the language on page 9, takes out the language, "appropriate the necessary funds for purchase" to explore the possibility of acquiring and that, by changing that, it does not tie us...tie the department into actually acquiring it nor tie the Legislature's hands. What it does is it authorizes them to explore the possibility of acquiring and take any action necessary to preserve the property if it's necessary to do so. Urge the adoption of this amendment.
