

SENATOR LINDSAY: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of your amendment is to produce another penal facility.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The mindset of you and the Governor at this point is to find more means by which to lock people up. Is that correct?

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that we have problems with a lack of facilities for inservice health care for children and youth who have mental disabilities? Are you aware of that?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I am aware of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's not important to us, is it?

SENATOR LINDSAY: That is important to me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What is this facility that we're talking about currently used for? Well, prior to its being shut down, what was it used for?

SENATOR LINDSAY: It was used as a psychiatric hospital.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would it be easier to use it for the purpose I may be suggesting, namely the inservice treatment of children and youth with these problems, or to convert it into a penal facility?

SENATOR LINDSAY: My guess is, at least physically, that it would be easier to use it for the psychiatric facility.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Lindsay, some of these questions may give the impression that I'm unaware of the positions you've taken on issues down through the years. I'm not unaware of those things. Sometimes, as a person comes to the end of his or her career or to the end of his or her life, mistakes can be made which will erase much of the good that they had done because they'll be remembered by the last significant acts that
