

SENATOR CROSBY: One more time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...endearment though. I have to confess this is not the "holly bible." This is one of the Harvard classics and it has several versions of the story of the play about Dr. Faustus, the man who sold his soul to the devil, but I think it's somewhat appropriate because, to my way of thinking, when we have the means to alleviate problems and we don't, we're selling our soul, if not to the devil because we don't believe there's such a one, to something which is beneath us. This Legislature is worthy of something better than always, always taking the mind-set of locking people up. What I did allege to be reading is actually a direct quote from the Bible of what Jesus is supposed to have said. That part is not untrue. If we start out with this project by focusing on locking people up, that's the only thing we will do. I know from serving on the Executive Board that it's possible to start negotiations and explore the possibility of that for the acquisition of a building without legislation. Legislation is not needed for that purpose. This legislation is being adopted or offered in order to lock us into the lock-'em-up attitude and posture. That's what I don't want to see happen. Senator Lindsay, Senator Wesely, and I were discussing an alternative to the language in his amendment and to the language that I'm offering. The alternative would be the creation within his amendment of an alternative. We would not restrict the exploration to one area. Here is a problem that is given when you study philosophy at a Jesuit university, and Senator Jensen, you said you never went to college so you were spared this, so I'm going to give you the benefit of that education which costs so much money.
