SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I pass this out. Thank you and members of the body, it is the intent of the Legislature that any money spent by the state for maintenance of the Rivendell property prior to acquisition of the property by the state be considered and applied toward the final purchase price of the property. It's my understanding perhaps it will need some maintenance if the state were to take it over, or even to consider using it...I just...in order to maintain the condition of the property. If that were to happen, I felt that that should properly be applied toward the purchase price if anything such as this came to pass, realizing that that does open the negotiation process up. But it would be my intent that...that we not be left holding the bag for the money that we may spend to service that or maintain that particular building in this interim process while we were studying or looking, if that is part of the negotiation. I have no great knowledge about the negotiation process or what's going on, other than what I've read in some of the papers. But if that is to occur, if we are to spend some money for maintenance, it ought to be considered as part of the purchase price or at least allowed for. That's the intent of my motion. Hopefully it will not take a long time because I truly would like to get through 1189 tonight, if we can. Thank you.
