

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I just want to assure Senator Wehrbein that we will finish with LB 1189. Now maybe 11:89 p.m., but we'll finish it. I think this is a very good amendment that Senator Wehrbein is offering. It is prudent and we ought to adopt it. And this shows that, unlike my colleague, Senator Wehrbein, with whom I very seldom see eye-to-eye, I don't automatically vote against everything he offers when it has quality, and I'm giving him a way to attack me. When it has quality and merit, I support his. What Senator Wehrbein is going to say, and Senator Chambers, when anything you offer has quality and merit, I will support you. With me having spoken for both of us, I don't think it's necessary for Senator Wehrbein to address that subject.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in support of the amendment. I think it has quality and merit, and for those reasons alone, I would support it. (Laughter.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein, as a meritorious quality senator, you have the option of closing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to waive my right to reproach him.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is the adoption of the Wehrbein amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, on the adoption of the Wehrbein amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Wehrbein amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amendment.
