SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely, you have seven and a half minutes left.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. I won't need them, and as part of the trio, we need Senator Janssen to form a quartet. I do think it's the reasonable way to go. We do have a facility that is there that can serve in treatment, whether it be mental health, whether it be substance abuse, focused on youth or otherwise. It seems to me that it's a valuable facility. It's one the state would benefit from, and looking into it as a wise move. I'd rise in support of the amendment as well. Thank you.
