Would you do...

SENATOR JENSEN: No. No, I would not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you very much. That's enough to make the case. We should say, case closed on Senator Lindsay's amendment. Here is a situation where people are doing this work, and it could be done in a way that the Department of Roads disapproves, but there's nothing they can say because they're controlled by the Attorney General but, nevertheless, the pay for these individuals will come out of the budget of the Department of Roads. Usually people believe that the hand that pays is the hand that controls. So let me ask this question of Senator Wehrbein. Senator Wehrbein, could it be stated that the Department of Roads from its budget pays the salaries of these attorneys?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But in this case, the hand that pays does not control, does it?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right. Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Than' you. Members of the Legislature, none of us would accept that type of arrangement. Although Senator Lindsay probably thought I would oppose his amendment, I don't. All logic, all business sense...
