CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: LB 604 is returned to Select File. Senator Pirsch to open on your amendment. Senator Pirsch, did you wish to open on your amendment?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Just would like to adopt this amendment and again readvance LB 604. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Did you wish to say anything in closing? Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Pirsch amendment to LB 604. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Select File amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Pirsch amendment is adopted. Senator Maurstad, did you wish to make a motion?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I'd move to advance LB 604 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: You've heard the motion to readvance LB 604. Those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is readvanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Schlock would move to return the bill for specific amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Schrock, to open on your motion to return.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to return LB 604 to Select File for a...to attach an amendment on to it that would give a Class I district the right to dissolve and become part of two or more districts that provide K-12 education by the process of people within the district who voted in the last election signing a petition. Right now the requirement is that 60 percent of the people
