

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend. (See FA614 on page 1850 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I'm going to read into the record the way the amendment would be drafted. On page 1, strike subsections (2) through (6). In line 6, insert a new subsection "(2) Seven additional members of the Legislature to be selected by the Executive Board; and". That's the new language which will tie into the existing part of the amendment that discusses not only the representatives of these others, but the language about Standing Committees. And maybe when you get to the part about the Standing Committees, because I did not want to try to put too much into this and maybe not draft it correctly, on page 1732 of the Journal.... Oh, it wouldn't have to be changed because it says the Legislature requests each Standing Committee, so that could remain the way that it is now. Would you agree to that, Senator Bromm, that...so what we would have then are three subsections, (1), (2) obviously, and (3). Because we would renumber, (7) would become subsection (3) and we would not change any language that exists in the present or the current subsection (3). Senator Bromm, do you have anything you'd like to ask me or add to that?

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Maurstad was just over here commenting in subsection (7) of the underlying amendment we have some language about the members listed in subdivisions (1) through (6) and that language would have to be corrected I believe either now or at some point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I wonder if, because of the way the amendment is drafted, that could be done by E & R or if we should do it.

SENATOR BROMM: That's what I wondered, if that wouldn't be a very appropriate E & R amendment. I don't know if the Clerk or anyone...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, maybe we could just say...maybe we could just correct that now, I mean, you know, while we're in the process of doing it.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.
