

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Avery says to go ahead on the vote. The question is, shall the Avery amendment be agreed to? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. A record vote has been requested. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1851 of the Legislative Journal.) Vote is 3 ayes, 32 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: By a narrow margin, the amendment is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk, the next amendment. Raise the call.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The next amendment is offered by Senator Janssen.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Janssen, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Mr. Clerk, which amendment do you have here?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator, this is 4317.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I...I need to...I'd like to substitute 4375 for that.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Is there any objection? Chair hears none, it's so ordered. (AM4375 may be found on pages 1851-52 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR JANSSEN: You basically heard the...this is about the same amendment that you heard on 1114, with a few...just one exception. We go back to the restricted fund budget paid for judgments against a governmental unit which require the obligation of the government unit to pay for such judgment to the extent such judgment is not paid by liability insurance coverage for that governmental unit. And on page 15, line 6, 9, we insert the expenditures to pay for judgments obtained against a school district which are required to obligate a school district to pay for such judgment to the extent such judgment is not paid by liability insurance coverage for a school district or the expenditures to pay for the sums agreed on to be paid by the school district to a certified employee in exchange for voluntary termination of employment.
