SENATOR LYNCH: Well, what I've got is a copy of Amendment 4281, because I can't read your handwriting either.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No. No, I'm sorry. What we are amending is Amendment 4375. The Lindsay amendment that we were just discussing has been withdrawn and we are not....

SENATOR LYNCH: I know. But the language left in whatever your amendment is still provides that the commission shall take into consideration limitation of Section 2, is that right?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, no.
