

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...on the record. And I would also like to say that I certainly support the combination amendment we have before us and that it has been a long time getting to this point here this evening. Certainly people on the Water Council, certainly Senator Beutler, Senator Dierks, Senator Bromm, Senator Wickersham have put in a long, long amounts of time on this bill. And I think that it's...in the very end, when we can all come together and find a compromise, it's something that I think that it serves us well. I think that those members that Senator Dierks talked about from Nebraskans First and Farmers Union feel that it is a better bill. And I think that certainly the amendment before you is certainly the pilot...

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...projects study helps to greatly improve the bill. And I support the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam President and members, I'll be very brief. I just had a couple of questions, and I don't...I'm not sure who to ask. I...the amendment looks good to me. Just for my edification, how many compacts are there with three states? Is there others besides Republican that may be potentially impacted? I don't know of any, I just...and if, I guess that's a future issue if there's more, we don't know that there will be. The other thing is, to reiterate the second part, there is no grandfather rights, that's what we're saying at this point in time, and is it true that there never will be or will that be subject to future discussion?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Wehrbein, if my...if I reply with my understanding of the matter, it doesn't do away with grandfathering necessarily. It just says that with respect to the establishment of a plan or with respect to...
