

August 15 on the furthest extension available to them and that gives them 15 more days to act upon the knowledge that they have just obtained that they're entitled to the refund provided by this amendment. We're very...I'm very, very supportive of the amendment, thank the Speaker for bringing it, urge the body to adopt it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Madam Lieutenant Governor, members of the body. Visiting with Senator Withem a week or so ago about this, you know, I was under the understanding that this was already being done, but then, recalling what we had talked about last year on the so-called Micron bills, why, apparently that didn't happen, and it's a fairness issue. I mean the companies are benefitting from this and, as we voted last year and this year, I guess that's fine. But when it comes down to a few dollars that the person has overpaid, I don't believe that the company could stand and say, yes, we want this also. I don't believe they would do that. But this amendment is an avenue where the employee will be able to get back to him what is duly his to begin with. So I thank Senator Withem for working on this, Senator Brashear and whoever else worked on it. It's the right thing to do and, as always, we try to do what is the right thing in this body. Sometimes we go at it a little wrong, but we try to do what's right. And I will give the rest of my time to Senator Withem or Senator Chambers, whichever one would like it.
