It'd be the simplest and easiest way for them to put it all together, but I don't know as I want to micromanage this at this point. But, you know, those three points be happy to work on and whatever was to be accomplished by this form thing if there's a better way of doing that. At this point, let me withdraw that amendment and I'll be offering it again at a later time.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

I don't think you probably want to do that. Senator Brashear might like it if you were to do that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I'll...

SPEAKER WITHEM: ..but I'm going to suggest that Michelle start right now doing a first stab at it, and then when she gets something drafted, then we can huddle over here and see what further work we need to do with it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, but I would be willing to take the three hours or however much time is necessary if we passed over the bill and then came back to the bill after we had worked
