

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah. My amendment would say any person can apply for these plates.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, I would think I would allow them, yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now let me ask Senator Brashear a question. Senator Brashear, after what you've heard, if you would...if you still want to leave it the way it is so that those people are restricted from obtaining the plates, I'm not going to quibble with it, because I really don't like the bill anyway. But I just felt that it should be broader than just residents. So if you are opposed to the amendment, I'm not even going to argue on it. I will withdraw it. Do you oppose the amendment?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Senator Chambers, as you've put it forward, and I appreciate the collegiality. I'll ask you to withdraw it, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...you're certainly not doing something...I'm looking here. Prisoner of War plates are for residents, and amateur radio station vehicles are for...special licenses are for persons, so it's obviously a clouded issue, but I'd ask you to withdraw it and will revisit the issue, if that's what you like.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will withdraw that.

SPEAKER WITHEM: It is withdrawn. And I'm clearing the board because I think people were...had their lights on to speak about that amendment specifically. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, I now have Floor Amendment 599, I believe, Senator. It's on page 1652.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I want this amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers to open.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is Floor Amendment 599. Yes, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, what this amendment
