

whatever reasons, and I don't know if it was an agreement, some type of compromise struck with the Chair of the Transportation Committee, or wherever it may have come from, but we're actually going to get dollars to brick and mortar again for facilities for athletes. We could be giving millions of dollars to tennis courts or to...actually I guess it could be intermural fields. It could be, you know, things for, you know, whatever on the athletic side. And what I'm trying to say, is that the best place that we can put...is that our best priority right now, or is there something else that is looming on the property tax side that it would be better for public education, and the university, basically, saying, look, we're going to take the status that we have, help our players with some of that money, but we also recognize that our players and students come from the high school and we're willing to support K-12 education by putting dollars in equalization to help those students have an equal opportunity for education. I think that'd be saying a lot for the university as well, rather than the higher education saying, we want all the money and we're willing to put it in brick and mortar or to buy tennis court nets or badminton rackets or whatever the case may be. I think the better message would be we'd be willing to help higher education, so...help education K through 12, excuse me. So that's the amendment that will be coming and, Senator Chambers, I will put the 10 percent in, though I don't...though I don't know if that will make much difference or not, but I will put that part in to see how...hopefully, that'll be a green neutral.
