all, and I think you were right in that it's technical, but I think we're past the point of technical things to this particular bill. The state is going to expend the funds, correct?

SENATOR AVERY: The state...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Yeah.

SENATOR AVERY: ...will not expend. Each of the entities that receive will be the ultimate spender.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Who is going to give the money to the different entities?

SENATOR AVERY: The state.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Okay, so we're going to know how much...

SENATOR AVERY: Department of Motor Vehicles.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: ...went to everywhere, right?

SENATOR AVERY: What?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: So we're already going to know how much is going to the different sources, right?

SENATOR AVERY: It will go into a fund and then it is distributed once it gets to the university, and I'm just asking that if these entities they at least show how much was spent, say, for building maintenance and how much was spent for education improvements. I think it will go to help the Appropriations Committee and I talked to Senator Wehrbein. He didn't oppose.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I recognize that Senator Wehrbein probably thinks this is an okay idea and at another time it might be. But my point is we're going to know how much of the money over \$5 million is going where and for what purposes. I mean I just oppose the amendment, don't think it's needed or necessary.
